*** PROJECTS ***

The **Ocean Wave firetruck model** is moving along the bus, and here is a recent attempt to cut out the two



front fenders from 1" wood. This particular piece had two screw holes and

hinge seat which we were able to dance around. I only scored them on the CNC and then cut them out on the Shed scroll saw.

You can make your own **PROJECT BOX** without actually having a project. I generally wrap the top of

the box with two runs of string then fold the flaps over and glue them down.
Sometime you'll first need to peel off some tape. I'd suggest you toss in a pencil, rule and pill bottle, the latter to hold the little bits



you'll never find once the box fills up. e.g. steering wheel, two license plates, three lamps and some small dowels.

Any excuse to use my CNC so this time it's a **walking stick**. I've been given the brass head and rubber tip



and just need to shape the end accordingly. Here you see the top with a tonge to fit up into the head and a 15/16"dia section tor the self threading collar. At least that's what the Lee Valley Tools instuctions said but they're a bit out of wack! For the tip I added a 3/4" round with a 20" taper. The CNC won't actually rotate the job so that was done by hand with cuts being made

along the top surface.

Paul has been busy getting ready for Christmas. Here are four snowmen he made representing the four grandchildren. They're made from cedar posts and lots of love.



*** TOOLS ***

A few shots around the shed, looking a lot like mine!

I dropped in to use the table saw but I changed my mind!

You'll be happy to learn a drawing was prepared showing all of the Dust Collection components.

The planer here was being used to chop too much off. Removing the rear cover (two screws) we found the 'new' fan blade choked up with inch long chips.
