

Gord Drayton writes that Chip Carving is not just for coasters. As an example he's sent along these two photographs of a Chip Carved Hearth Stool made from a basswood plank and held together with a friction fit. The legs fit into slots on the top and are held in place by the the stretcher board and a wooden pin. The pattern is chip carved into the wood and is finished with an oil based polyurethane. He made a pair of these over 12 years ago and they have been in use as stools and plant holders since. Great to sit on when putting your boots on.







The image above is a handle waiting for a walking stick. The prototype is pretty rough but this was only the second time I'd used the home brew rotating A-axis on my CNC. It's unfortunately belt driven and has a hard time holding the job angle when the router is working against it. The 3/8"D peg on top is held by the chuck. The 3/4"D tongue fits into the head, then a straight body and a tapered end down to a 3/4"D rubber tip. The tapered end is twisted by 60 deg. This all for only a 34" stick leaving a 1/2" spare on the Y-axis!
