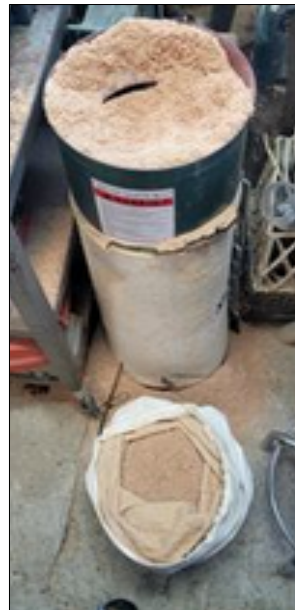

*** WALKS ***

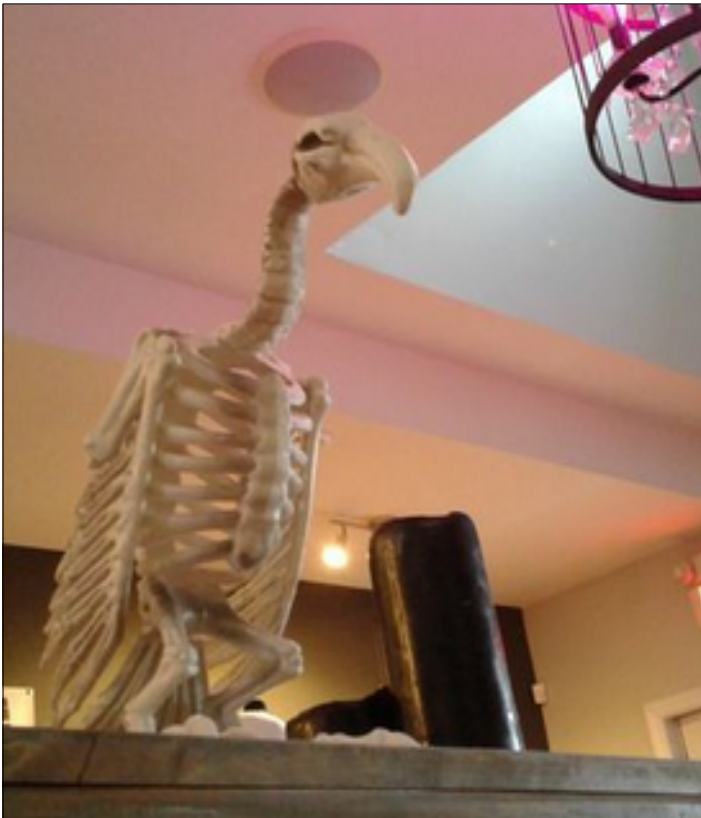
