The first one on the left was made out of sumac and comes complete with a worm hole. Ornament #2 is part of a root from a cedar tree which has a red coloured wood running through out it in unique patterns. The short ornament #3 was turned from the infamous invasive species buckthorn. It is very interesting to turn as it has various shades of a orange red colour in the wood. The one on the right is part of a banksia nut that hails from Australia. All the ornaments have been finished with a Beall buffing system.
